EMERGENCY POSSESSORY ORDERS

Tenants may file an Emergency Possessory Order if the landlord has interfered with the tenant's access to or possession of the rental unit as set forth in Ind. Code Section 32-31-5-6.

Landlords may file an Emergency Possessory Order if the tenant has committed or threatens to commit waste to the rental unit that has caused or will cause immediate and serious injury, loss or harm.

If you have any questions about Emergency Possessory Orders, please review the relevant statute set forth in Ind. Code Section 32-31-6 *et. seq.*

If you are unsuccessful with your Emergency Possession Order in Court, you must file a new lawsuit and pay the appropriate filing fee in order to seek relief under the applicable laws for possession.
